






Welcome to our new pupils...





Witton Pilot Project





Flagship School

We are really pleased to tell you all about some very good news we have recently received. Newfield School has been awarded Flagship School Status for Inclusion! Flagship Status is achievable if you have 3 successful Inclusion Quality Mark assessments which we gained in 2006, 2009 and 2012.

This is a fantastic achievement, well done everyone, particularly Julie Jones, Outreach Coordinator for all her hard work! Because of the diversity of needs of our pupils we are constantly evaluating and redeveloping our Outreach Programme. We now have a progressive programme of Inclusion activities that begins in Class 1 with pupils from local nursery schools coming to share play activities. Local school children of all ages join our classes for a variety of classroom activities and we also have community visits. From TG1 students attend Witton Park High School on a weekly basis and from TG5 students work at Stanley Grange, Myerscough College and Blackburn College. This interaction with their mainstream peers has immense benefits for our pupils. We also know that this is having an effect in the community as children with special needs are beginning to be recognised as not that different after all! Inclusion is a very important part of our curriculum and we are very grateful to all our link schools who support us so enthusiastically.

Jeans for Genes Day 2012

In October, Newfield joined in with 'Jeans for Genes Day' by dressing in jeans or casual clothes and selling & buying toast, tea cakes and cakes. Former pupils returned for the morning to help with the cafe and carry round the specially decorated, infamous bucket.

We like raising money for 'jeans for genes day' because lots of the children who come to Newfield have genetic disorders, so we hope that we are helping scientists to find cures and solutions in the future for some of the conditions that affect us today.
