
SPECIAL EVENTS

This term we have taken part in a number of special events, raising awareness and enhancing our learning...

Pupil Voice has been really high on the agenda this term, with <u>RRSA</u> meetings, <u>School Council</u> meetings and the <u>BwD Youth Elections</u> - we always want to know what our children think and so we really encourage taking part in these activities and acting as advocates for each other.

During Children's Mental Heath Week we celebrated 'Time to Talk' day with pupils thinking about being healthy inside and out, and talking and taking part in activities that make them feel good.
