AWARDS & ACCREDITATION

As a school, Newfield is always striving for excellence and this term, even though we were in lockdown, we continued our work and we were able to have 2 'virtual' visits from assessors.

In May, we welcomed assessor Steve Gill into a series of virtual meetings and were successfully re-accredited as a <u>Flagship School for Inclusion</u>. The school was first accredited with the Inclusion Quality Mark in 2006 and has held it ever since. The Inclusion Quality Mark is an award that is given to schools who can demonstrate that they provide equal opportunities for all their pupils regardless of age, gender, ethnicity, background and attainment. It is about each individual being a valued member of the community and providing every child with a real sense of belonging.





2020-2023

In June, we were delighted to achieve the Wellbeing Award for Schools (WAS) for the very first time. The WAS has been developed in partnership with the National Children's Bureau (NCB) and focuses on ensuring that mental health and wellbeing sit at the heart of school life and helps schools to promote emotional wellbeing and mental health across school. As you will all hopefully know (from the many things we talk about in the blog and newsletters), Newfield has long been committed to supporting wellbeing and so we are very proud of this recent achievement - recognising our work on wellbeing. Assessor Helen Mills held virtual meetings with parents, staff, governors and a pupil. she went on a virtual tour of school where we highlighted the many facilities that we have that help us to support wellbeing and mental health. She noted in her report that "The nurturing ethos of the school and effective partnerships across the whole school community has ensured that children, families and staff feel safe, supported, secure and happy. The whole school team at Newfield School work passionately to make a positive difference to the lives of all the young people, parents and staff".

We are looking forward to welcoming all of you into school as soon as possible to celebrate both the end of lockdown and these fantastic achievements.

TRANSITION ASSESS SUPPORT CURRICULUM

The majority of our children have not been able to attend school since March and we are keen to ensure that once they return we provide each of them with the very best opportunities to learn.

Our plan is to get all of our children back into school and accelerate their progress in order to make up for lost time due to COVID-19.

The way we will do this is outlined below, in our

TASC - Transition Assess Support Curriculum

Transition - back into school, return to familiar routines, supporting children to makes sense of their environment and the world around them, resulting in improved behaviours, self-confidence & independence skills and readiness to learn. We have organised pupils into classes where they know most of the pupils and staff in the group, which is important so that they can re-connect with familiar people.

Assess - where the child is now functioning in all areas as a new baseline. Some children may have temporarily lost skills or taken a step back after such a long time out of school. Once teachers assess and understand where a child is in their learning - they can plan activities for the child to make progress and set new targets where appropriate.

Support - for the progress in whichever areas are most important for the child and family. These areas for development will vary and are individual to each child, but are likely to include:

Communication
Physical skills
Positive behaviour
Social skills
Independence
Access to learning
Sensory regulation

TASC Force - We will ensure that the school counsellor and subject specialists have additional capacity to work with class teachers and offer intensive support in the various areas - our Newfield TASC Force!

Your child's class teacher will contact you personally about individual needs as your child returns, so please do not hesitate to let us know what will help or ask what you need to know.

We are all really excited to plan for having the Newfield Family back together and will work with you to ensure a safe, happy, productive return to school.







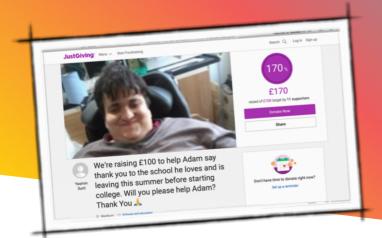


29 June - 19 July 2020

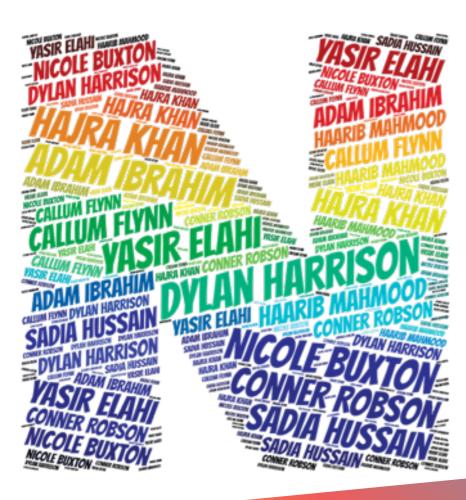
GOODBYE TO OUR LEAVERS
